IAH Terminal A Domestic Redevelopment Program (IAH-DRP)

IAH DRP

HAS is currently coordinating with our Airline partners on plans to provide 17+ new Narrow Body gates (Multiple Aircraft Ramp System (MARS) capable gates) to accommodate for domestic growth at IAH. The program may include modifications to existing facilities and/or development of new facilities with reconfiguration to and/or new associated facilities such as, but not limited to, terminal facilities, taxiways, aprons, hydrant fuel systems, landside and parking facilities, Remain Overnight (RON) positions, utilities, systems, as well as enabling projects, to accommodate the gate demand.

IAH TERMINAL B TRANSFORMATION PROGRAM (IAH-DRP)





IAH TERMINAL B TRANSFORMATION PROGRAM (IAH-DRP) SCOPE

Terminal B North Pier:

The two existing flight stations (originally opened in 1969) will be removed and replaced with two new
piers designed to accommodate 22 gates (mainly narrowbody aircraft gates with widebody aircraft
capabilities) and associated modern spaces and passenger amenities including hold rooms, restrooms, and
concessions.

Terminal B Central Processor:

 The footprint of the existing processor will be expanded to accommodate the construction of a new inbound/outbound baggage system, modernized and expanded ticketing hall facilities, a modernized security screening checkpoint, and passengers' amenities such as a United Club.


Terminal B South Pier:

 Improvements to Terminal B south piers will include demolishing an existing central ground-loaded aircraft boarding pier, and associated apron improvements.






IAH TERMINAL B TRANSFORMATION PROGRAM (IAH-DRP) SCOPE









HOU Domestic Redevelopment Program is a HAS project implemented by Southwest Airlines. The EPM team will have oversight of this Program on behalf of HAS. The Program is in Design and early construction phase.

 Renovation and updating of interior finishes and wayfinding located in the Hobby baggage claim hall.


Baggage System Upgrades












BAGGAGE SYSTEM UPGRADES (HOU-DRP)







- Invitation to Bid (ITB) or Design-Bid-Build (DBB) Hard Bid
- Competitive Sealed Proposals (CSP) Hybrid ITB with evaluation scoring
- Request for Qualifications (RFQ) Evaluation scoring (price submitted only by the recommended firm)
- Request for Proposals (RFP) Evaluation with price scored
- **Design Build (DB) Two Step:** RFQ/RFP with both evaluated RFP issued with 30% design complete

RFQ Overview Appendix

<u>Submittals Validated for Responsiveness</u> – A vendor must respond to all material requirements to be deemed responsive.

<u>Submittals Evaluated</u> – An evaluation committee will evaluate the submittals based on the published evaluation criteria.

<u>Submittals Shortlisted</u> – Shortlisted firms will proceed to the next step of the process.

<u>Oral Presentations/Interviews</u> – Shortlisted firms may be scheduled for an in-person oral presentation and/or interview.

<u>Notice of Intent to Award (NOITA)</u> – Once issued, the firm will have a specified time, typically 10 business days, to provide required forms as listed in the solicitation document (i.e. certificate of insurance (COI), Bonds, etc.).

<u>Negotiations and Submit Fee Schedule</u> – The contract and fee scheduled will be negotiated after issuance of NOITA.

<u>Submit to City Council for Approval</u> – After completion of negotiations and firm contract signature, the contract will be submitted to City Council for approval.

Notice to Proceed (NTP) – Once the agreement is countersigned by the City Controller, the NTP will be issued to the awarded firm.

Applying for City of Houston Certification Timeline

City of Houston OBO – Certification Unit certifies firms meeting the criteria for M/W/S/DBE Certification.

MWSBE Certification requires an online application and can range between **60-120 days** for processing.

DBE Certification require an online application and can range between **30-120 days** for processing.

Should you identify a subcontractor eligible for certification but not yet certified, please urge them to apply online as soon as possible at <u>City of Houston - Mayor's Office - Office of Business Opportunity (mwdbe.com)</u>.
